Anadikki	Storm worshipping tribesmen with a long history of fighting the digijelm of the Yolp Mountains and the Durnvoking savages. More recently their hilly land has been fought over by the EWF and the Carmanians.	☩ (☩) (☩)	Wool kilt and cloak	Falx, Spear
Arirae	The Hunter Lords of Arir worship the bear god and his wife. They live in the hills south of Mt. Jernotius and are famous for their skill at arms. They hate the Durnvokings with a passion.	☩ (☩)		Spear & Shield
Brolian	The less civilized cousins of the Anadikki. They live in the steep hills between the Anadikki and Baloris tribes. Most clans have neither farms nor metal working.	☩ (☩)	Hide kilt, wool cloak	Spear, Sword
Carmanian	Westerners who migrated rather than be God Learner subjects. Now their Shah rules an expanding empire. Carmanians have rigid social castes and believe in maintaining a personal Balance in all things at all times.	☩ (☩)	Robe and trousers	Sword & Shield
Dara-ni	Alkoth, Darjiin, and Sylila warred over the rich lands of the Erinflarth for centuries, resulting in a mixed culture. Thubana is a Dara Happan polis.	☩ ☩	Toga or trousers	Spear & Shield
Darjiin	Worshippers of SurEnslib the Heron and Manimat the Sun, who live near rivers and marshes or ancient fortified hilltop towns built by the Manimati. They loathe the Alkothi.	☩	Trousers or loin-cloth	Spear
Durnvoking	Warlike tribesmen of "Broken Pot Country." They live in small villages where the women farm and fish the river while the men hunt and make war. Durnvokings see all their neighbors as inferior, suitable only for raids.	☩ (☩)	Hide kilt, wool cloak	Spear
Henjarl	Part of the ancient sun-worshipping empire of Dara Happa, ruled by the hell-city of Alkoth. Their main god is dread Shargash.	☩ ☩	Toga	Mace & Shield
Naverian	An old urban culture related to the Pelandans, named after the goddess who brought them civilization. They live east of Mt Jernotius.	☩ (☩)		Spear & Shield
Pelandan	Oronin Valley natives, famed as artists. They consider themselves citizens of their city-state rather than "Pelandans." Southern Pelandans (Bisosae) worship Bisos the Bull and Lady Charmain, goddess of Lake Oronin.	☩ (☩)	Dhotee	Spear & Shield
Rist	The Talargs, or Wood-Men, are concentrated to the east of the Yolp Mountains, but are found to the south and west as well. Generally aloof, they sometimes befriend the Dara-ni.	☩		Bow, Spear
Sylila	Orlanthi who worship the Sky Bear and breed fine horses. They have long been part of the EWF.	☩ (☩) ☩	Trews or kilt	Axe, Spear
Talastari	Seven groups of storm worshipping tribesmen live in hilly Talastar. They favor Hagoderth the Ram. The lowland cities of Lakrene along the Erinflarth dominate politically. They have been part of the EWF since 850.	☩ (☩) ☩	Wool trews and shirt	Sword, Spear
Tawari	Tribal worshippers of the bulls Bisos and Esus. Less-civilized cousins of the Pelandan Bisosae, known for their violent tempers. They live in villages and towns near the Doresel and Esel Rivers (in Patasi, Vanstal, and Worion).	☩ (☩)		
Yolp	Digijelm, the Dark Men who once served Arkat and still guard a dismembered portion of the evil god Gbaji. An Orlanth temple is in Xarkarsh.	☩ ●	shirt and trousers	Mace

These cultures are all found within about 200 miles (320 km) from Anadikki lands, as of about 900 S.T.
